**ARCHBISHOP'S 5 YEAR CAPITAL CAMPAIGN:** The Archdiocese is in the midst of a 65 million dollar 5 year capital campaign - One Faith, One Family, One Future.

Our parish's target is \$277,500.00 spread over 5 years. This represents 1 year of average income minus a 25% "back to parish" rebate which we have elected to forfeit (making our target smaller).

Pledge cards and envelopes for direct giving to the Archdiocese will be available Sunday, May 12.

In agreement with the Archbishop, we have elected to forgo home visitation by fundraising teams, but, however, any annual shortfall in our pledge obligation will be paid by the parish directly. Our annual obligation is \$55,500. If for any reason you do not wish to give directly, please consider increasing your general parish giving so that we can make our target.

Given that the Archdiocese has paid hundreds of thousands of dollars defending our rights in court, it is only right that we do what we can.

Principle uses for the campaign monies are:

- Supporting Parishes, Schools, and Evangelization: \$22 million
- Honoring and Caring for Retired Priests: \$17 million
- Strengthening Villa St. Francis Skilled Nursing Facility: \$10 million
- Improving Savior Pastoral Center: \$10 million

### **HOW TO SHARE IN THE GLORY OF THE RESURRECTION (1939) BY BISHOP RICHARD RYAN, C.M.:**

We will consider the conditions which we must fulfil if we are to share in the glory and happiness of Our Lord's Resurrection. The necessary and indispensable condition, that we may be glorified with Him, is that we must share in His sufferings; we must crucify our flesh, with its vices and concupiscences. Who does not desire a happy resurrection? Our desires are vain, if we are not prepared to die to sin, and to rise with Jesus Christ to a new life. The resurrection of the body is deferred to the last day, and will endure for eternity; but, fortunately, the restoration of the life of the soul is daily and hourly in our power even to the hour of death; after that moment we are powerless. Let us think well on it while there is yet time. Let the thought of our future resurrection encourage and stimulate us to walk courageously in the holy fear of God, keeping His commandments, keeping our bodies subject to the spirit, taking up our cross and following Him. All this will weigh heavily on human nature, and it will sometimes cry out and complain; but the sufferings of the life are not worthy to be compared to the joy and the glory that shall be revealed in us. If we frequently receive the Risen Saviour into our souls by Holy Communion, then, we have the pledge of our own future happy resurrection. This is His promise, "He that eateth My Flesh and drinketh My Blood hath everlasting life, and I will raise him up on the last day." God created us in His own image and likeness. He has destined for us a home not built by hands, but eternal in the heavens; in order to secure that eternity of happiness for us, the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity died on Calvary's Cross, and rose gloriously from the dead on Easter Sunday morning.
