**BISHOP RICHARD RYAN ON THE PRECIOUS BLOOD (1939):** The month of July is devoted to the Precious Blood of Our Lord. Though this devotion is as old as our Holy Faith, there was no special feast in its honour until the early part of the nineteenth century. The Mass and Office of this Feast have much in common with those of Passiontide; but during this month the shedding of Our Lord's Blood is regarded from a somewhat different standpoint. Then we sorrow at the sufferings of Christ; now we rejoice at our gain. Man was an outcast, having nothing, but the Precious Blood has made him rich with the riches of eternity.

Our Lord Himself assures us that unless we drink His Blood we shall not have life in us. St. Paul, being cleansed himself by that atoning Blood, seems to be the special preacher of that Blood which had so glorified itself in his conversion. "The chalice of benediction which we bless, is it not the Communion of the Blood of Christ?...Now, in Christ Jesus, you who sometimes were afar off, are made nigh by the Blood of Christ." To the clergy of Ephesus, he speaks of the bishops who rule the Church of God, which He hath purchased with His own Blood. In these texts and in many others, we cannot fail to notice how the idea of the offering of the Precious Blood is associated by the Holy Ghost with man's restoration to the peace of God.

"You were not redeemed with corruptible things as gold or silver...but with the Precious Blood of Christ, as of a lamb unspotted and undefiled" (1 Pet 1:18-19). The price, then, of our salvation is not to be estimated by corruptible things, gold and silver, but by the Precious Blood shed for our ransom. It cannot, therefore, be reckoned by human standards; it far exceeds all human valuation; it is something divine and infinite. This is the stream that flowed from the Sacred Heart on Calvary's mount and washed the souls of men. This is the stream that mystically flows from every Catholic altar and gives life and purification to all who come within its reach. It is the life of every grace and the power of every blessing. It is the price of our redemption.

To those who read the Gospels, it will be evident that Our Lord was sparing of His words. His public ministry lasted only three years; even His miracles were comparatively few. But in the shedding of His Blood, He was prodigal. Not only once did He shed It, but seven times. One of them belongs to Our Lord's Infancy, and the other six to His Passion; and in almost every scene of His Passion, what an outpouring of His Precious Blood!

But there are other wonders of Its prodigality. Our Lord has so arranged that at every turn of life it should be conveyed to our souls by those glorious channels of divine intervention—the Sacraments. The Sacraments have been devised by Our Lord Himself; they are not mere signs of grace; they cause grace in us by the omnipotence of God. They are the means by which, ordinarily, His Precious Blood is applied to our souls. They are God's way of dispensing It. By them the Precious Blood is always flowing in the Church. Think of absolution in the Sacrament of Penance. Of all miseries, the misery of sin is the greatest. It troubles all the peace of life. It makes the thought of death a torture and the thought of eternity intolerable. Where shall we look for deliverance? Certainly not to ourselves, not to any earthly power, not even to any saint, however holy. It is to the Precious Blood of Our Lord, shed for the remission of sin, that we must look for the forgiveness of sin and the and for the recovery of God's friendship. It cries out to us at all hours. To Its fountains God calls the sinner, that his sin may be washed away. There is no remission of sin in anything else.
