BISHOP RICHARD RYAN ON ST. MARY MAGDALENE (1939): On the 22nd of this month, the Church will celebrate the feast of St. Mary Magdalene. Her sins were so great, her conversion so wonderful, and she took such an important part in the tragedy of Calvary, that we may well spend time reflecting on the marvelous conversion. I think that Christ never showed Himself in a more tender light, and the beauty of His character had never been seen in a more touching form than in His attitude towards this sinner. There is something in the moral beauty of this conversion so touchingly human, yet so tenderly divine, so Christlike in its unexampled pity and clemency, that it not only proves the authenticity of the incident itself, but even now, after the lapse of centuries, melts our hearts with an exquisite pity and tenderness.

No sin, naturally speaking, could have been more repulsive to the most pure heart of Christ than that of the sinner at His feet; yet, while the faces of the Pharisees are hardened with contemptuous disgust, His face shines with the beauty of Divine mercy. Their code of laws would permit no pity for one who had fallen as she had. They did not know, as He knew, the struggle going on in the soul of that rescued sinner kneeling at His feet, striving to burst asunder the chains of passion and sin. To forgive sins is the privilege of God alone; and so, looking upon the kneeling form of one who now loved Him much, and who would love Him still more in the years to come, He poured in her sin-weary soul the flood of Divine grace that was to make her one of His greatest saints. "Thy sins are forgiven." "Thy faith hath saved thee; go in peace." She is done with sin. Her whole sinful past is washed away. She is no longer the lost woman; the Good Shepherd has taken her to Himself and clothed her with a new womanhood. A great fall is atoned for by a still greater repentance.

Like all else in the Gospel history, the scene at the house of Simon is forever being repeated. It is true that the Pharisee is with us still, and has not changed. There are, unfortunately for themselves, people in the world who are unable to understand the God of mercy stooping down in the confessional and healing the bruised and contrite heart of the sinner; they are even unable to understand the sinner who sets out to expiate sin. But, as we know, in the Church, the tears of the Magdalene still flow and the ointment of deep and peaceful sorrow is unceasingly poured upon the Son of Man. From century to century the sinner will speak to Him, and He will not cease to speak to the sinner the consoling and encouraging words, "Many sins are forgiven to them who have loved much—go in peace."
