BISHOP RICHARD RYAN ON THE DOLOURS OF OUR LADY (1939):

The human race is marked and scarred by suffering. It runs through all the forms of created life from the lowest to the highest. The whole Christian dispensation rests upon suffering. Our Blessed Lord was the Man of sorrows, and by suffering He redeemed the world. Experience teaches us that the nearer to Christ, the nearer to the Cross. The lives of the saints, differing indefinitely as they do in outward circumstances, all agree in this, that in a marked way they share in the suffering of Christ. Nearly all His Apostles died martyrs. They must be like their Lord. The same law wound itself round the martyrs of all ages. They mingled their blood with the Precious Blood of their Redeemer.

It is not surprising, then, that as Our Blessed Mother was most highly favoured by God and came nearest to Him, so she of all creatures should be most deeply afflicted. God loved her with an unspeakable love; she was sinless and had nothing in herself to expiate. But the same law which lies round her Divine Son must lie around her; and that law is a law of suffering, of sacrifice and expiation. She would have been a mere instrument rather than a mother had she been separated from Him in this. He left heaven to seek pain and suffering; it is His way to send the cross to those who love Him most. Mary was, therefore, to be made conformable to the image of her Son. We who are so often puzzled by the mystery of pain, and find it so difficult to explain the presence of suffering in the world, will have our doubts to a great extent removed, if we can only bring ourselves to look reverently into the sword-pierced soul of Mary. It will be an immense help to make us accept with docility and resignation an order of things in which those who are most innocent are by an inscrutable arrangement of Providence made to bear the cross which the guilty find so intolerable.
