HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION—FEAST OF ALL SAINTS—FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 1: Mass will be offered at 6:30AM, 12 noon, and High Mass at 7:00PM. There will be no 9:00AM Mass.

COMMEMORATION OF ALL SOULS—SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 2. Three Low Requiem Masses will be offered successively beginning at 6:30AM. At 9:00AM there will be a Sung Requiem with absolution at the catafalque for all deceased parishioners and benefactors. Reminder: Catholics are permitted to receive Holy Communion twice in a day.

A COUNT OF MASS ATTENDANCE IS BEING TAKEN DURING THE SUNDAYS OF OCTOBER.

FROM THE ENCYCLICAL, *SUMMI PONTIFICATUS*, OF POPE PIUS XII, 20 OCTOBER 1939:

28. The present age, by adding new errors to the doctrinal aberrations of the past, has pushed these to extremes which lead inevitably to a drift towards chaos. Before all else, it is certain that the radical and ultimate cause of the evils which We deplore in modern society is the denial and rejection of a universal norm of morality as well for individual and social life as for international relations; We mean the disregard, so common nowadays, and the forgetfulness of the natural law itself, which has its foundation in God, Almighty Creator and Father of all, supreme and absolute Lawgiver, all-wise and just Judge of human actions. When God is hated, every basis of morality is undermined; the voice of conscience is stilled or at any rate grows very faint, that voice which teaches even to the illiterate and to uncivilized tribes what is good and what is bad, what is lawful, what is forbidden, and makes men feel themselves responsible for their actions to a Supreme Judge.

30. The Holy Gospel narrates that when Jesus was crucified "there was darkness over the whole earth" (Matthew xxvii. 45); a terrifying symbol of what happened and what still happens spiritually wherever incredulity, blind and proud of itself, has succeeded in excluding Christ from modern life, especially from public life, and has undermined faith in God as well as faith in Christ. The consequence is that the moral values by which in other times public and private conduct was gauged have fallen into disuse; and the much vaunted civilization of society, which has made ever more rapid progress, withdrawing man, the family and the State from the beneficent and regenerating effects of the idea of God and the teaching of the Church, has caused to reappear, in regions in which for many centuries shone the splendors of Christian civilization, in a manner ever clearer, ever more distinct, ever more distressing, the signs of a corrupt and corrupting paganism.

90. The family has a special mission, for it is the spirit of the family that exercises the most powerful influence on that of the rising generation. As long as the sacred flame of the Faith burns on the domestic hearth, and the parents forge and fashion the lives of their children in accordance with this Faith, youth will be ever ready to acknowledge the royal prerogatives of the Redeemer, and to oppose those who wish to exclude Him from society or wrongly to usurp His rights.
