BISHOP RICHARD RYAN ON THE FEAST OF ALL SAINTS (1939): A few days ago, the Church celebrated the Feast of All Saints. On that Feast, no saint was forgotten; all were embraced in the love of their mother without exception. She looks to the Old Dispensation and to the New and calls them all her children. Her eyes were fixed on that “Great Crowd” and as she thinks of their dignity, their security and happiness, she rejoices and calls upon her children on earth to look up and behold the glory of the Church Triumphant.

The saints are our models; we are therefore bound to imitate them. One of the most dangerous temptations to which we are exposed in the world is bad example. St. Augustine calls it a torrent of iniquity bearing down to the ocean of eternity the maddening throng of sinners. “O fatal torrent,” he exclaims, “will thou not cease, how long will thy impetuous force sweep away the children of Eve into that vast and perilous ocean which even those whose brows are signed with the Cross of Christ can scarcely traverse in safety?”

But in the Providence of God, one of the greatest barriers against this torrent of iniquity is good example which acts as a powerful incentive to virtue. What we need more than anything in the world at present is the example of noble lives of great souls who will teach us the value of our souls, the example of men and women who lived in our world, shared our temptations and met with the reverses and troubles we meet with, but who in spite of all these, constantly aspired to purity, sanctity, and nobility of life, who put aside all mediocrity, rose higher and higher bringing others with them by the very force of their example.

No matter into what irregularities we may have fallen and no matter how much we may have withdrawn our allegiance from God, the serious consideration of the example of the saints will produce three wonderful effects: 1. It will persuade us to live holily; 2. It will sweeten the practice of holiness; 3. It will take away every pretext which the world or our corrupt nature might suggest against the practice of holiness.
