BISHOP RICHARD RYAN ON OUR LORD'S TEMPTATION (1939): Immediately after His baptism, the Gospels tell us that Our Lord was driven or led by the spirit into the desert. Why? St Matthew tells us the reason: "To be tempted by the devil." What is this we hear? The Son of God tempted! The Son of God provoked to do evil and brought into contact with the enemy of God and man! The Eternal Father had just proclaimed that Jesus Christ is His beloved Son, and immediately this beloved Son is led into the desert to be exposed to the suggestions of the evil one. This is a mystery indeed, at once profound and surprising. But the teaching of our Holy Faith throws some light on this mystery. The Second Person of the Blessed Trinity in becoming man accepted, as St. Paul teaches us in his Epistle to the Hebrews, all the conditions and all the miseries of our fallen nature, sin alone excepted. He was Sanctity and Holiness, and knew not sin. All His life long He prayed as One Who knew not sin. It is quite true that He taught us to use the humble petition, "Forgive us our trespasses," and "deliver us from evil." But He personally never used that petition when speaking to His Father. When the shadows of death were gathering around Him on Calvary, and when His soul was weighed down in utter dereliction, those who stood round His Cross never heard Him cry, "Father, forgive *me*." They only heard the cry, "Father, forgive *them*." But, coming into this world to redeem mankind, He placed Himself in contact with sin in so far as His sanctity and holiness would allow Him. He experienced all the bitterness of sin with the exception of its guilt. His soul was not subject to ignorance or weakness or to those disordered movements which in our cases are the result of original sin. The temptations, therefore to which He submits are wholly exterior; they can never touch His soul. He could be tempted only by "principalities and powers...the rulers of this world of darkness."
