MESSAGE OF POPE ST. JOHN XXIII TO CHRISTIAN FAMILIES ON THE FEAST OF THE HOLY FAMILY, 1960:

Today, as the Church places the example of the virtue of the Holy Family in the consideration of the faithful, we are pleased to invoke the protection of Jesus, Mary and Joseph over the beloved families of all our children.

We imagine them all present here, united with us in the same affection, and we understand the desires, anguish and fears of each one. Our hearts know how to rejoice with those who rejoice and suffer with those who suffer (Rom 12:15). We also know the difficulties that exist in families, especially in the many whose sacrifices are often ignored and sometimes even not appreciated.

We know that the worldly spirit, employing ever greater incentives, tries to insinuate itself into the holy institution of the family, which God has wanted as custody and safeguard of the dignity of man, from the first awakening of life to impetuous youth and mature age to old age.

Therefore, we direct, better, we repeat to all the invitation of the liturgy to look with sure confidence at the example of the Holy Family that Jesus sanctified with ineffable virtues.

The secret of true peace, of mutual and permanent harmony, of the docility of the children, of the flourishing of good manners is in the constant and generous imitation of the kindness, modesty and meekness of the Nazareth family, in which Jesus, the eternal Wisdom of the Father, is offered to us together with Mary, her most pure mother, and Saint Joseph, who represents the heavenly Father.

In this light, everything is transformed into the great realities of the Christian family, as we have shown in the address of the Christmas Eve Mass: "Beams illuminated by the light from on high; sacred and inviolable marriage with respect to its four characteristic notes: fidelity, chastity, mutual love and holy fear of the Lord; the spirit of prudence and sacrifice in the careful education of children; and always, and in all circumstances, willingness to help, to forgive, to share, to give others the trust that we would like to be granted. This is how the house that never collapses is built."
