A NOTE ON PLENARY INDULGENCES: An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints. In general, the gaining of indulgences requires certain prescribed conditions and the performance of certain prescribed works. Indulgences can be applied either to oneself or to the souls of the deceased, but they cannot be applied to other persons living on earth. To gain indulgences, whether plenary or partial, it is necessary that the faithful be in the state of grace at least at the time the indulgenced work is completed.

A plenary indulgence can be gained only once a day. In order to obtain it, the faithful must, in addition to being in the state of grace: 1) have the interior disposition of complete detachment from sin, even venial sin; 2) have sacramentally confessed their sins; 3) receive the Holy Eucharist; 4) pray for the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff. It is sufficient that the Confession, reception of the Holy Eucharist, and prayers for the intentions of the Holy Father be carried out within several days (about 20) before or after the indulgenced act. Prayer for the Pope's intentions is left to the choice of the faithful, but an "Our Father" and a "Hail Mary" are suggested. One sacramental Confession suffices for several plenary indulgences, but a separate Holy Communion and a separate prayer for the Holy Father's intentions are required for each plenary indulgence.

Traditionally, the intentions of the Holy Father had five fixed categories: the exaltation of Holy Mother Church; the extirpation of heresy; the propagation of the faith; the conversion of sinners; and peace among Christian rulers.

Special indulgences are available throughout the year, but each day one may receive a plenary indulgence in the following four ways: 1) Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament for one half hour; 2) the pious exercise of the Way of the Cross; 3) recitation of the Marian Rosary in a church or an oratory; or in a family, a religious community, or a sodality of the faithful or, in general, when several of the faithful are gathered for any good purpose. 5) the devout reading or listening to the Sacred Scriptures for at least one half hour.
